



# IF YOU DON'T GET THIS YOU'LL STRUGGLE...

For many of the 47 years that I have been a Christian I have been blessed to sit under solid Biblical preachers. Gerald Martin at Amite Baptist, Marvin Collins at Park Forest Baptist and now Dr. Mark here at Live Oak.

Each time I worship our Lord, and hear His Word proclaimed, I look for what He is saying to me. I continue to want to learn, for we never arrive down here.

I served with Marvin for 20 years. He used to say, "John 15:5 is the centerpiece of the New Testament. If you don't get this, you will struggle as a Christian." What was he talking about?...

### John 15:5

"I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in Me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from Me you can do nothing."
-IESUS

It is easy for us in modern day Christianity in America to accept Jesus and then get too busy to engage in a relationship with Him. Jesus desires a relationship with us that is real and personal. Scripture calls us to that relationship...

- 1. "Be still and know that I am God" -Psalm 46:10
- 2. "My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow Me." -John 10:27
- 3. "This is eternal life, that they know You, the only true God and Jesus Christ whom You have sent." -John 17:3
- 4. "...but one thing is necessary. Mary has made the right choice and it will not be taken away from her." What was Mary doing? Spending time with Jesus. -Luke 10:38-42 (HCSB)

Why is Scripture's call for us to engage in a relationship with Jesus so important? Well, let's consider John 15:5...

"I am the vine; you are the branches: Those who abide in Me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from Me you can do nothing."

- The vine provides the nutrients and empowering necessary for a branch to bear fruit.
- 2. For this to occur the branch must *abide* in the vine. The word "abide" in the Greek New Testament means *to remain attached* to or *to continue in*. In the Hebrew Old Testament, it means to pitch your tent, or to *come dwell with me*.




3. Jesus is calling us not to just accept Him and go on about our lives, but to continue in a relationship with Him, to remain attached to Him. Why? Because when a branch doesn't continue in the vine it becomes dried out. It becomes a stick.

Kyle Idleman says of John 15:5... "Life is not about production, it's about connection." Early in my Christian journey I was caught in the Performance Trap. My focus was on going, doing, accomplishing and achieving. Those things can be good, but not when they have gotten to the point to where we no longer have time **to be** with Jesus. In all that doing I became burned out and frustrated. You see, healthy doing comes out of first having been with Jesus.

Jennie Allen says of Jesus' call to our life in John 15:5 to abide in Him, to stay connected to Him in a relationship... "Withness is the fuel of the Christian life." We can avoid burnout and our life can bear fruit. This will work for our own good and the good of others. It will also work to God's glory!

Well, what about this **fruit** that Jesus speaks of? What's He talking about? Jesus, out of our time with Him will begin to work transformation in our life. We will begin to reflect more clearly the nature and character traits of Jesus in and through our life. In Galatians 5:22-23 the Apostle Paul says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." These were the attributes and character traits that Jesus reflected when He walked on this earth in a human body. And when we stay connected in a relationship with Him, our life also begins to reflect those very same attributes and character traits!

Rick Warren says, "I believe God's number one goal for our life as Christians is that we become like Christ." It can happen. We can grow in Christlikeness, if we stay connected to Jesus in a daily...moment by moment relationship...as we do life with Jesus. If we don't get this, as Christians, we will struggle.





### **ENGAGING IN THE LOCAL CHURCH**

In our busy world, it's easy for our spiritual practices to be confined to Sunday mornings. Yet God desires His followers lead a lifestyle of worship, integrating our faith into every aspect of our life (Rom. 12:1). Worship is more than singing songs, or attending services. A worship pastor once said, "we are not called to make music; we're called to make disciples." The goal in worship is for believers to grow in Christ, and activate their faith by getting involved in the local church. Growth in the faith doesn't happen from a stage; it happens up close, and in relationship with other believers.

Our faith in Christ is to be the foundation on which our lives are built. Worship should lead to a deeper relationship with the Lord through Bible study, serving others, and being in community with like-minded believers. These help your faith get activated, and allows spiritual growth to take root in your life. Your relationship with the Lord grows from a once-a-week, check-the-box exercise to a way of life, defining your identity.

Engaging in the local church opens the door for opportunities to build genuine relationships with other believers. Our faith thrives on community. Participating in church life helps establish deep, meaningful connections with others. As you share life together - through worshiping, studying, and serving together - you create lifelong bonds supporting your spiritual journey. Other believers are close enough to notice, lift you up when you're down, pray for you when you're hurting, visit you in the hospital when things are difficult, or challenge you to look more Christlike in all things. These aspects of accountability and building one another up are essential to the life of a believer (Prov. 27:17; 1 Thess. 5:11).

At Live Oak, we have many opportunities to get involved in the church beyond Sunday morning. There are dozens of Bible studies throughout the week, service projects to help in our community, as well as weekly ministries to volunteer in and serve the Lord. One of those is Worship Ministry. A worship leader uses music and lyrics to point people to Jesus. But as Louie Giglio has said, "we are not offering a show; we're holding out a Savior." The melodies we use and the lyrics we sing are simply vehicles to point people to Jesus.

If you have a heart for the Lord, and want to use your talents to help others pursue Him, I'd love to hear from you! We have several opportunities to get involved - whether on Sunday or midweek, whether you're a singer, musician, or both. Our team also operates with a rotation model, giving volunteers opportunities to serve, while balancing that with opportunities to worship alongside your family and be spiritually filled. Raising children with strong Christian values is an adventure filled with joy, challenges, and countless opportunities to grow together in faith. As parents, our goal is to help our kids reflect Christ's character and live according to biblical principles. Here are some fun and practical ways to instill these values and weave faith into your family's daily life, all backed by Scripture.

### 1. BE THEIR FAITH ROLE MODEL

Kids learn a lot by watching their parents, so let them see your faith in action every day!

- Scripture: "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6)
- Try This: Show them how you pray, read the Bible, and make decisions based on your faith. They'll learn a lot from your example!

### 2. MAKE PRAYER A FAMILY AFFAIR

Serving others helps kids develop compassion and learn to put others first.

- Scripture: "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." (Hebrews 13:16)
- Try This: Plan family service projects, like baking cookies for neighbors, volunteering at a local charity, or creating care packages for those in need.

### **6. CULTIVATE GRATITUDE**

Teaching gratitude helps kids appreciate their blessings and see God's hand in their lives.

- Scripture: "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)
- Try This: Start a gratitude wall where everyone can add sticky notes with things they're thankful for. Review them together during family time.

### 7. CREATE A LOVING HOME ENVIRONMENT

Kids thrive in a home filled with love, support, and encouragement.

- Scripture: "Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins." (1 Peter 4:8)
- Try This: Have regular family game nights, movie nights, or just spend time together doing fun activities. Show them that home is a place where they are loved unconditionally.

Raising kids with strong Christian values is an exciting journey filled with joy, faith, and love. By living out your faith, engaging in family prayer and Bible study, and creating opportunities for service and gratitude, you can help your children grow into Christ-like individuals. 

### 6 INSIGHTS INTO ANGELS & DEMONS

Taken from Episode 108

Welcome to the Family Answer Man, where we address your questions about family dynamics from a Biblical perspective. In Episode 108, Dr. Mark and Pastor David delve into the topic of angels and demons and their impact on our lives and families.

### 1. ANGELS AND DEMONS IN EVERYDAY LIFE

Angels and demons are not just supernatural concepts; they impact our daily lives and family dynamics. Many people have reported experiences they attribute to angelic or demonic interventions, often during pivotal moments. Whether it's a miraculous escape or a chilling encounter, these beings play an unseen role in our world.

### 2. ANGELS IN SCRIPTURE

The Bible references angels extensively, with 34 out of 66 books mentioning them. Angels are mentioned 275 times, from Genesis to Revelation. Their roles range from messengers and protectors to participants in key biblical events, like the birth of Jesus. This scriptural foundation affirms their significance in the spiritual realm.

#### 3. THE NATURE OF ANGELS

Contrary to popular belief, humans do not become angels after death. Angels were created before the world, and they possess intellect, emotion, and will. They are incredibly powerful, with one angel in the Old Testament single-handedly defeating 185,000 Assyrians.

Their ministry includes proclaiming, predicting, protecting, and providing, particularly in the life of Jesus.

### 4. ANGELS IN THE LIFE OF JESUS

Angels played crucial roles throughout Jesus' life. They predicted and proclaimed His birth, protected Him during His childhood, and provided strength during His temptation and agony in Gethsemane. Even at His resurrection, angels announced His victory over death. Their involvement underscores their importance in God's plan.

### 5. DEMONS: FALLEN ANGELS WITH A MISSION

Demons, according to Dr. Mark, are fallen angels who oppose God's purposes. They possess intellect and are organized in their efforts to thwart believers. Demons can influence, oppress, and distress Christians, but they cannot possess them. Non-believers, however, are vulnerable to possession if they open themselves to demonic forces.

### 6. ANGELS IN EVANGELISM AND PROTECTION

Angels are actively involved in evangelism, sometimes opening doors or keeping demonic forces at bay. They also observe Christians' worship and prayers, supporting them in the spiritual battles they face. This unseen war between angels and demons influences the spiritual and physical realms, profoundly affecting our lives.
