- A. It points out all that is wrong with you
- B. It reveals our insecurities
- C. Insecurities bring us to places and people that often abuse us and hurt others
- D. Toxic patterns are then created
- E. Toxic patterns are only changed by grace and truth

III. The problem with the Pharisees (their plot and ploy against Jesus)

- A. They didn't like Jesus
 - 1. He was changing things
 - 2. He was minimizing their power

B. The Pharisees:

- 1. Were ready to judge
- 2. Wanting to judge
- 3. Willing to judge
- 4. Waiting to judge
- 5. Watching to judge

C. The Pharisees were:

- 1. Feeling superior (pride)
 - a. Pride is the mother of all sin
- 2. Pointing fingers
- 3. Desiring to condemn
- 4. There was no gentleness, grace or godly wisdom
- 5. Galatians 6:1

V. The response of Jesus

- A. He writes in the dust
 - 1. The very finger that wrote the 10 commandments
 - 2. The very finger that warned Belshazzar in Daniel (writing on the wall)
 - 3. Is now writing in the sand to set a woman free caught in adultery

VI. This was a serious offense (then and today)

- A. Spiritual/legal/relationally
 - 1. The breaking of a covenant
 - 2. Causing great pain (perhaps the greatest) in the human soul
 - 3. A pain that has collateral damage (others are impacted and hurt)
 - 4. What was Jesus writing?
- B. Jesus comment
 - 1. "He who is without (this type) sin cast the first stone"
- C. This was a moral examination
- D. A legal maneuver
 - 1. Must have 2 to 3 witnesses testify, bring accusation
 - 2. They all left
- E. Jesus got between her and judgement
 - 1. That's your story
 - 2. That's my story
 - 3. That's our story
 - 4. That's grace
