#### There Is One Thing We All Have In Common

#### I. All of us will experience temptation

- A. Some will be "minor"
- B. Some will be our greatest regret
- C. The reason it will be our greatest regret
  - 1. It destroyed our family
  - 2. It derailed our future
  - 3. It depleted our faith
- D. Temptation baits us, then shames us
- E. When it comes to temptation there is always more at stake than what we think

# II. One of the most dangerous & damaging temptations is infidelity/immorality

- A. Most "emergency sessions" are about infidelity
- B. The reality is that one's family, future, & faith are about to be ruined & radically changed
- C. Why? Because they did not pause & realize there is more at stake than the moment
- D. This is why the Bible teaches infidelity is a problem/sin unto itself, and it impacts you and everyone you love

## III. What to do (First)

- A. Recognize temptation comes to you throughout your marriage
  - 1. Pause remember what's at stake
  - 2. Have boundaries & guardrails
  - 3. Recognize the correlation between temptation & your confidence in God

4. Recognize God has put consequences into every decision we make

## IV. The template of temptation

- A. When will it come?
  - 1. At any time
  - 2. Often after a spiritual victory, break through, or experience with God
  - 3. After a decision for the Lord
  - 4. When tired, exhausted, depleted, and your appetite is starving
- B. Who is behind it?
  - 1. Satan wants to see you fail
  - 2. He knows your weakness
- C. Why does this happen?
  - 1. To steal, kill, & destroy

#### /. An analysis of Jesus' temptation & ours

- A. "Turn stones into bread"
  - Meet a legitimate need in an illegitimate way
  - 2. Make your power all about you
  - 3. Take matters into your own hands
  - 4. Only care about the moment & your appetite
  - 5. Having the confidence God provides & there are more things important than the moment
- B. 6 primary temptations that occur that lead to infidelity
  - Allow themselves to get emotionally connected
  - 2. Allow themselves to get addicted to lust
  - 3. Put themselves in situations they known can be a problem

- 4. Become desensitized, no conviction, no conscience, "no big fear"
- 5. They see it as sport
- 6. They see it as revenge
- C. The next temptation: using God for their own purpose & gain
  - 1. Doing things you know are wrong, expecting God to bail you out
  - 2. God is not mocked
  - 3. The law of sowing & reaping
- D. The 3rd temptation: take a short cut
  - 1. Do the right thing the wrong way
  - 2. Temptation: worship me
  - 3. "All these Kingdoms I will give you"
  - 4. Satan is saying:
    - a. Here is a shortcut
    - b. No cross
    - c. No pain
    - d. No breaking your Mom's heart
    - e. No death
  - 5. Had Jesus fallen to temptation
    - a. No hope for us
    - b. No Eternal Life
- E. Every temptation you have is in one of those categories
- F. Always more at stake than we realize
- VI. What was at stake at the temptation of Jesus?
  - A. Your Eternal future
  - B. Jesus had to be sinless to be your substitute and take your place
- VII. What's at stake when we fall to temptation?
  - A. Our faith
    - Every time we fall, our conscious pulls away from God

- 2. Over time many will leave God
- 3. Many then become critical of
  - a. God
  - b. The Bible
  - c. God's people
- 4. Sin breaks our confidence in God
- 5. All of us are a series of failed temptations away from leaving God

### VIII. What's the next thing to do to protect from temptation?

- A. Recognize what's at stake
  - 1. Family
  - 2. Future
  - 3. Faith
- B. Declare to the temptation
  - 1. "You will not take my family"
  - 2. "You will not take my future"
  - 3. "You will not take my faith"
- C. Invest in your spouse
  - 1. Turn toward them instead of turning away (connect with them)
  - 2. Know them fully, be transparent
  - Admire, accept, appreciate, acknowledge, (give) affection
  - 4. Solve problems, avoid drama
  - 5. Overcome gridlock
  - 6. Have common goals
  - 7. Love with all 4 loves
