 - C. One day He will do the same
- II. Five ingredients of a kingdom
 - A. Kingdom must have a king
 - 1. Jesus is King of kings
 - 2. Every knee will bow to King Jesus
 - B. A king rules
 - 1. He will rule
 - 2. He will reign
 - C. A kingdom has people that are a part of the kingdom
 - 1. His redeemed
 - 2. His adopted
 - 3. His sheep
 - D. A king has a vision and will for his people

- E. A kingdom has a land, a space, from where to rule
 - 1. Jesus rules from Jerusalem
 - 2. On the throne of David

III. Why we can believe it

- A. Zechariah mentions "In that Day" sixteen times
 - 1. Phrase "Day of the Lord"
 - 2. Day Jesus establishes His Kingdom on earth
- B. Why this is literal
 - 1. Zechariah 9:9
 - 2. Jesus rode into Jerusalem exactly as Zechariah said
 - 3. Sold for thirty pieces of silver
- C. There will be a siege against Israel
 - 1. All nations gathered
- D. Shield of Israel
 - 1. God will protect His people
 - 2. As the world seeks to destroy, God brings deliverance
 - 3. The Messiah Himself rescues Israel
- E. The sorrow of Israel
 - 1. They realize Jesus is Messiah
 - 2. They realize how far they strayed
 - 3. They turn back to God and to Messiah

- F. Salvation of Israel
 - 1. The King has returned
 - 2. The enemies defeated
 - 3. Israel saved

- B. Shared rule and life eternal

 - 4. You/we regin and rule
- C. All enemies are vanquished
 - 1. Satan is bound
 - 2. Death defeated
 - 3. Evil conquered
